As I'm writing, the weather outside my study window changes by the minute: bright sunshine followed by dark clouds and near-torrential downpours, and five minutes later we're back to blue skies. It is not unlike what we are going through at the moment, a bit of a rollercoaster of experiences, expectations and challenges.

We are not quite sure yet if an end to the serious difficulties caused by Covid is in sight, if we can adjust and learn to live with the virus without any more serious variants emerging, so that all of us, including all who are more vulnerable, can resume a somewhat more normal life.

The current restructuring of the Church of Scotland, at national, Presbytery and parish level, presents its own challenges — many changes to adjust to, many discussions to be had. There are of course fears about what this will look like for us, but also exciting opportunities to make the Church more fit for purpose in an ever-changing society, so that we can live God's love and serve our communities in the most appropriate ways.

Many in our community have lost loved ones over the past two years, many of us have lost friends. Many of us are currently living with illness and are awaiting or undergoing treatment at the moment. In all the pain, in all the struggles, we see friends and family, we see our community rallying round and offering support, care and love.

For a recent service, I have reflected on the Southern African philosophy of *ubuntu* – which translates roughly as 'I am because we are', a belief that there is a universal bond of sharing which connects all of humanity, that we are defined as individuals in our belonging to a community. As we go through the ups and downs of life, of the current situation, we know we are not alone: we can share the sadness and worries as well as the joy and excitement, and stand alongside each other. And as we support one another and face challenges together, we know that God is by our side, too, that we are always, in our joy and in our pain, held safely, valued and loved, in God's hand.

Easter celebrations

Church life news

Holy Communion

In January, we celebrated Holy Communion together in church for the first time in nearly two years, using prefilled individual cups and wafers. While this is different to how we have celebrated the sacrament in the past, it allows us to come together in Communion while keeping everyone safe. We will celebrate Holy Communion again, in the same way, in our Sunday services on 20 March and 15 May. All are welcome to join in: if you participate in the service from home, through our recording and livestream, please have some bread and wine or juice ready to join in.

Sunday Club

We're having great fun at Sunday Club — every first Sunday of the month, during the 10am service at Yester Church. It is for children of pre-school and primary school age, and our team of helpers has recently also had a few more additions (all PVG checked). During Sunday Club, we enjoy a snack and explore the Bible story that we heard in the service through crafts and games. Please just come along — no need to pre-register. And on Easter Sunday, we'll have a family service for all ages, with a special surprise for the children, so we hope you can join us!

Filming services

We are continuing to film our church services and to make them available online for those who can't be there in person. If you would be interested in joining our (currently very small) team of videographers, please speak to Anikó – we would very much appreciate more help, and training will be provided.

Covid guidance

While it looks like we might finally get closer to an end to the difficult, and often heartbreaking, challenges that Covid-19 has presented to us all, we still need to make sure that we protect one another, and especially the most vulnerable among us. It is a simple thing we can do to follow what we are called to: to love our neighbours as we love ourselves. At the time of writing, it is still a legal requirement for facemasks to be worn in church (with the exception of children under the age of 12, and those with medical exemptions). The Kirk Session has decided, for the time being, to continue keeping a 1m distance between households for Sunday services and keeping an attendance register (which is held confidentially for three weeks) to enable contact tracing if required. As this might change as the situation evolves, please follow Government updates. We are also keeping our website updated with any changes to the guidance.

The Reports and Accounts for 2021 have been approved by the Kirk Session in February, and will be presented to the congregation in an AGM on Sunday 27 March, after the service in Saltoun Church.

Parish restructuring update

As you know, conversations about the future structure of the church are currently ongoing. The proposals for our area are in line with all of Lothian Presbytery, and indeed the whole of the Church of Scotland, taking account of the general decrease in congregation members, income, and number of ministers available to serve the Church across the country. For us, that means that we are in conversation with our neighbours across the Haddington area – St Mary's and Haddington West as well as Morham and Garvald. Currently, there are three full time ministers working in these parishes – the Rev Alison McDonald, the Rev John Vischer, and our own minister, the Rev Anikó Schütz Bradwell. The congregations are worshipping in eight different buildings. In due course, the ministry allocation for the area will be reduced to 1.5 full time equivalent. We are also currently considering the use of our buildings, to enable us to provide the best ongoing service and mission in our area while using our resources as best as we can. Presbytery is keen that agreements are finalised by the end of this year, with a draft plan coming to Presbytery in April. Changes will only come into place when a vacancy arises, or with the full agreement of the ministers and Kirk Sessions involved. As we continue these conversations, we are very grateful for the commitment and dedication of our members, and foremost our elders, who serve in so many varied ways. We have seen this commitment in kindness of word and action, as well as in the offering of financial resources alongside that of time and talents. As we move forward, we depend not only on God's grace, but also on the continued commitment of all our members, and of those considering becoming members of our church, in our service to one another and in continuing as a congregation of God's church in our area. If you have particular concerns in relation to these questions, please speak to Anikó or any of the elders. Kirk Session meetings are also always open to all.



Fletcher Hall, East Saltoun – an update

Users of the village hall and grounds will know that the hall building is in need of replacement and that this requires a huge effort in planning and fundraising. To enable us to make progress, we are changing the legal status of Saltoun Community Association (SCA), the charity that manages and operates the facilities on behalf of the community.

However, legal ownership of the property remains with successors to the three original property trustees who were named in our 60 year-old constitution (a Deed of Trust). Anikó is one of the current property trustees. This is no longer an appropriate arrangement and makes it much more difficult to attract external funding or access to grants. We have therefore set up a new charity with incorporated status.

A Charity Reorganisation will allow us to transfer the legal title and the funds in the bank account from the old charity to the new one. Once the asset transfers are completed, the old charity will be removed from the Charity Register and the role of the external property trustees will end. We are required to have approval for these changes from residents of Saltoun Parish before we proceed further. A public meeting will be held in the Fletcher Hall at 7.30pm on Tuesday 15 March, for residents to vote on a special resolution to proceed with the reorganisation process.

In a separate development, SCA has taken over the redundant telephone kiosk in East Saltoun. Local fundraising, including contributions from the Knot Knits group and by Haddington & Lammermuir Area Partnership, has enabled the kiosk to be refurbished and defibrillator equipment purchased. We hope to have the defibrillator in use very soon.
